



**ASSOCIATE DEGREE NURSING (RN) & PRACTICAL NURSING (PN)
ADMISSION PROCEDURE FOR FALL 2022
QUALIFICATION DEADLINE: March 25, 2022**

****LPN to ADN Advanced Placement (Transition) and Paramedic to RN Bridge qualification deadline: February 18, 2022, at 4 pm****

A. Halifax Community College Application

_____ Students must complete the general admissions application to Halifax Community College by **March 25, 2022, at 4 pm**

_____ The application includes submission of high school and all post-secondary transcripts required for program admission.

_____ Submit a copy of the signed Social Security card to the admissions department.

B. Nursing Program Application Process

_____ Attend a Nursing Information Session at Halifax Community College and complete the Health Sciences admission form. **Students must attend an information session for Fall 2022 admissions (August 2021-February 2022), even if a previous information session was attended. All sessions are virtual and require pre-registration with a nursing faculty advisor.** Please see the instructions on our website to sign up for a session. www.halifaxcc.edu/healthsciences.

_____ The student's overall grade point average must meet or exceed 2.5 as of the end of the Fall 2021 semester—the most recent college transcript with a minimum of 12 hours of non-developmental credit determines the GPA. If the student has no transcript with 12 or more credit hours, then a high school GPA is used to determine eligibility.

_____ Sciences classes taken must have been completed within five (5) years before acceptance into the program or taken while in the nursing program. If BIO 169 was taken more than five years ago, it must be repeated. If BIO 168 and BIO 169 were taken more than ten years ago, both courses must be repeated.

_____ After attending an information session, applicants will need to take the HESI admission assessment (A2). Testing will be offered at Halifax Community College from August 2021 through March 2022. Test scores are valid for three years. Students may take the HESI at HCC one time per admission cycle. Test results are accepted for external testing sites; the Program Director of Nursing will validate scores. Students will be required to pay \$50.00 (fees subject to change) with each attempt to take the A2. Picture ID is required at the testing site. Halifax Community College will only accept A2 scores that are directly transferred from HESI. **Students who are repeat testers must notify the testing coordinator before sitting for the exam.**

C. Determination of Admission Status

**** HESI A2 results *must be submitted* to be considered for admission into the nursing program.****

___ Applicants are ranked and selected for admission based on the following criteria:

1. HESI A2 composite percentage score

- 85% or above (+15)
- 80% to 84.9% (+10)
- 75% to 79.9% (+6)
- 68% to 74.9% (+4)
- 60% to 67.9% (+2)
- 60% or less (0)
- <55% (not eligible for admission)
- ****HCC will accept HESI A2 results recorded within the past three years****
- ****HCC will accept HESI A2 results taken at another institution if taken within the past three years****

___ Applicants will be notified of their **general admission status** by **mail** utilizing the address on file at the college before the extended registration period for the fall semester.

*****All additional program correspondence, including notification of acceptance into the nursing program, will occur through the Halifax Community College student email. Applicants will be notified of conditional admission*****

D. Ranking/Conditional Acceptance/Alternate List

1. HCC can accept 35 students into the Associate Degree Nursing Program and 18 students into the Practical Nursing Program each Fall semester.
2. Students should indicate desired program on their health sciences application by checking either ___ Practical Nursing, ___ Associate Degree Nursing, or ___ Advanced Placement. The Health Sciences shall be filled out following attendance of an Information Session.
3. A letter of conditional acceptance will be sent by email to the HCC email address of the students who ranked highest in the application process. In addition, letters indicating placement on the alternate list will be sent to all other students who met the ranking qualifications but were not offered seats in the program at that time (all correspondence will be through the HCC email account).
4. Students who do not enter the nursing program in Fall 2021 for any reason will need to reapply to be considered for future admission. HCC does not maintain a waiting list. However, students may reapply by attending a nursing information session and completing a Health Sciences Admission form.

If the ranking process results in the same score for more than one student to be offered a seat, priority will be given first to a student currently attending HCC, then the highest overall GPA.
