HCC Secures 100% Pass Rate

WELDON, N.C. – As of August 1, Halifax Community College’s (HCC) 2019 registered nurse class had a 100% passage rate of the national certification exam. The National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses, or the NCLEX-RN, is the national exam that is required to complete the criteria to become a registered nurse.

“Our mission is to set our nursing students up for success,” Eller said. “I am incredibly proud of the extra effort by the faculty and the students. We have an amazing team of educators. Not only are they good at what they do, but they care about the students they work with.”

In an effort to help students prepare for the exam, the nursing department took extra steps to assist them. Each student participated in the Assessment Technology Institute, an assessment program specifically for nursing. Each student took a practice test and received a predictor score. In addition, the students received information on the areas in which they needed to improve. This allowed for more focused studying in the weeks leading up to the test. Finally, the faculty led study sessions for the students, helping maximize their study time and gauge their future success on the test.
