WELDON, N.C. – Halifax Community College will resume normal operations on Monday, May 17, 2021. The College has been operating under strict COVID-19 guidelines and will resume normal operations on May 17. To ensure the safety for all faculty, staff, students and visitors, HCC will continue with temperature checks upon entrance to the campus, social distancing and preventative cleaning measures to ensure a safe environment.

“The safety of everyone involved is our primary focus,” says Dr. Michael Elam, president of Halifax Community College. Dr. Elam adds, “Throughout the past year, our dedicated staff have maintained a safe environment for the campus. We are excited to resume some normalcy after a very challenging year.
