

## Contractual Obligations

1. Keep four (4) individual counseling appointments with your learning coach each semester.
2. Sign up for tutoring (academic enrichment) with your learning coach for English or math if you receive a grade of "C" or below.
3. Participate in three (3) cultural/professional development workshops each semester. Participants must remain for the entire workshop. To receive credit, you should complete the P.R.I.D.E. workshop evaluation at the end of the session.
4. Participant should inform their assigned learning coach any time they will not be able to participate in an activity, workshop, or cultural event.
5. The following are required activities/events members *must participate in* unless approved by their learning coach 48 hours prior to the event:
  - a. Attend the Job Fair (mandatory)
  - b. One monthly male forum (mandatory)
  - c. P.R.I.D.E. new member orientation (mandatory)
  - d. Men 2 Men Summit (mandatory)
  - e. P.R.I.D.E. Induction program (mandatory)

## Getting Along With Others

Traditionally, learning to get along with others requires practices that display respect for individual differences, positive role model behaviors, and observing the golden rule. The stages of getting along with others includes:

- ♦ refraining from infringing on the rights of others;
- ♦ monitoring your nonverbal signals to others on whether you want someone to approach you;
- ♦ respecting other's rights to personal space, not wanting to be touched, and freedom of expression;
- ♦ treating others the way you want to be treated; and,
- ♦ interacting with others without over-competing against them.

## Guidelines

The following represent guidelines for *appropriate/acceptable* personal presentation and conduct expected of all P.R.I.D.E. men. While participation in the program is open to all men, formal acceptance, remaining in good standing and a **"P.R.I.D.E. student of record"** is based on your decision to adhere to P.R.I.D.E. requirements and traditions.

***It should be noted*** that employment opportunities, holding offices, professional development and travel opportunities, induction into MOD or GEM programs, etc., are all based on loyalty to these codes. Abiding by these codes are essential first steps in the transition to the student-professional and passage to manhood and honor.

## Category of Offenses

### Category I

- ♦ Violation of classroom rules (arguing with instructor, disrupting instruction)
- ♦ Violation of dress and grooming (sagging pants, hats, do-rags)
- ♦ Unacceptable social behavior as it relates to HCC Student Code of Conduct (obscene language)

*1st Violation:* One-on-one with learning coach; sign contract of violation

*2nd Violation:* Loss of next activity privilege

*3rd Violation:* Loss of workshop

*4th Violation:* Dismissal from program

### Category II

- ♦ Disrespect of females
- ♦ Gambling on campus
- ♦ Possession, use, or distribution of tobacco products or smoking paraphernalia
- ♦ Possession or distribution of pornographic material
- ♦ Being disrespectful to or bullying others.
- ♦ Cheating, committing forgery, or lying (academic dishonesty)
- ♦ Being disrespectful to any HCC employee

*1st Violation:* Loss of activity

*2nd Violation:* Loss of workshop

*3rd Violation:* Dismissal from program

### Category III

- ♦ Assault, violence, profanity, or disrespectful gesture toward any HCC employee
- ♦ Fighting, arguing, or creating public disturbance, endangering health and safety of HCC campus environment
- ♦ Possession of a weapon or explosive device
- ♦ Possession, sale, exchange, use of, or being under the influence of illegal drugs, alcohol, or non-prescription drugs
- ♦ Breaking, entering, trespassing, theft, or trespassing on HCC/P.R.I.D.E. property
- ♦ Sexual harassment

*1st Violation:* Dismissal from program
