Workforce & Economic Development

Workforce & Economic Development courses provide lifelong learning opportunities which are available at convenient times in many locations. Our courses are non-college credit courses open to anyone 18 years or older. In some cases, 16 and 17-year-old students with special needs may be admitted. A notarized parental release is required, which must be accompanied by the principal's or superintendent's permission. The notarized parental release must be submitted to Halifax Community College before the 16-17 year old is enrolled in class. Courses are designed to help individuals with job advancement, personal enrichment, or just for plain fun. In addition, courses are designed to engage adults for the purpose of learning a trade, upgrading a skill or cultural enrichment.

ADMISSIONS

Halifax Community College is a public, two-year, educational institution with an open door policy. The college provides vocational, technical, college transfer, and lifelong learning opportunities for anyone of suitable age who has the desire to learn.

REGISTRATION

Students may register and pay appropriate fees at the first class provided preregistration is not required. Students are responsible for any and all supplies and books needed. **FEES AND SCHEDULES ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE BASED ON DECISIONS OF THE N.C. GENERAL ASSEMBLY. REGISTRATION FEES WILL BE REFUNDED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE N.C. COMMUNITY COLLEGE SYSTEM'S POLICY. THE FOLLOWING REFUND POLICY WILL BE OBSERVED FOR ALL EXTENSION COURSES:**

1. A student who officially withdraws from an extension class(es) prior to the first class meeting shall be eligible for a 100% refund. Also, a student is eligible for a 100% refund if an applicable class fails to "make" due to insufficient enrollment.
2. After the respective class begins, a 75% refund of the registration fee shall be made upon the request of the student if the student officially withdraws from the class prior to or on the 10% point of the scheduled hours of the class. Note: This rule is applicable regardless of the number of times the class meets or the number of hours the class is scheduled to meet.
3. A 100% refund shall be made if the student officially withdraws from a contact hour class prior to the first day of class of the academic semester or term or if the college cancels the class. A 75% refund shall be made if the student officially withdraws from a contact hour class on or before the tenth calendar day of class.

PREREGISTRATION

You may preregister for all courses before the first day of class by coming to the Workforce & Economic Development Office in the 400 Building and paying the appropriate registration fee. You may also preregister for most courses by calling 252-536-7261, 7212 or 7216.

YOUR PREREGISTRATION IS IMPORTANT TO THE SUCCESS OF THE COURSE, SO PLEASE REGISTER EARLY! IT IS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT THAT YOU ATTEND THE FIRST CLASS MEETING! A COURSE MAY BE CANCELLED, IF FEWER THAN TEN STUDENTS ENROLL. MANY COURSES REQUIRE THAT YOU ARE IN ATTENDANCE THE FIRST CLASS MEETING.

COST

Registration fees for courses vary with the type of course. Please refer to the fees noted for each category to determine the cost of each course. All Literacy Education courses are free and excellent value. However, when appropriate, students are responsible for paying GED testing fees. Halifax Community College does not discriminate in the admission and treatment of students nor in the recruitment and employment of personnel.

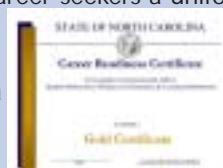

Career Readiness Certificate (CRC)

The Career Readiness Certificate is an assessment based credential that gives employers and career seekers a uniform measure of key workplace skills.



The Career Readiness Certification is a portable credential that promotes career development and skill attainment for the individual and confirms to employers that an individual possesses basic workplace skills. Career Readiness Certification participants are assessed in: Reading for Information, Applied Mathematics and Locating Information. Based on assessment results, customers may take the nationally recognized WorkKeys Test and earn a Bronze, Silver or Gold certificate that will demonstrate proficiency in these areas. Testing fees will be accepted at the cashier's office Monday - Friday 8:30am - 5:00pm on the day of the test. HUMAN RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT (HRD)

Human Resources Development (HRD) is a pre-vocational and pre-employment skills training program designed to educate and prepare persons for success in the workplace. HRD is mainly intended for those persons who are unemployed, underemployed, dislocated workers, or employed, but seeking skills upgrading or retraining. It is state funded through the NC Community College System.

The purpose of the Human Resources Development Program (HRD) is to educate and train individuals for success in the workplace. HRD classes offer interviewing skills, resume/application preparation, job search assistance, computer skills, soft skills and much more!

The HRD program focuses upon customer wants and needs. Training may include a variety of topics relating to job orientation and motivation, employability skills, self-sufficiency or customized skills training. Instruction can be provided on either an individual or group basis. Training length will vary according to customer needs. HRD can be linked to other college training programs or connected to agencies outside the institution where appropriate. Upon completing prescribed classes, students are assisted with job placement or further training.

The Core curriculum for HRD training includes, but is not limited to the following components:

HCC OFFERS LITERACY EDUCATION TO COMMUNITY



Halifax Community College's Literacy Education program offers Adult Basic Education (ABE), General Educational Development (GED), Compensatory Education, English-as-a-Second Language, and Self-Improvement components. Classes are available for individuals desiring to improve academically and personally, increase opportunities for gainful employment or promotions, continue education goals, assist children with homework and/or strengthen skills which makes one more prepared to participate in new or existing industries in the Roanoke Valley and beyond.

HCC has an open-door policy of Workforce & Economic Development, for everyone who has the need and desire to learn. Any adult, 18 years or older, may enroll in HCC's Literacy Education program. New students attending on-campus classes are required to attend New Student Orientation and students attending off-campus classes are able to enroll on the days that classes meet. Our highly qualified and motivated instructors provide individualized and group instruction and computerized instruction that involve real-life situations. Additionally, instruction is provided by utilizing magazines, newspapers, videos, computerized instruction etc.

On January 2, 2014 the GED® Testing Services began the new 2014 GED® tests! **The new GED® tests are computer-based, but not offered online through the internet.** The GED® exam offers high school equivalency credentials to individuals who did not obtain a high school diploma. Classes do not have registration fees. However, students are required to pay a GED® Examination Fee(s). In North Carolina, all students taking the GED® examination are required to pay a total of \$80 which covers the entire battery of GED® tests. If students don't pass, they will get two discounted retakes for every GED® subject test purchased. Therefore, the discounted retake fee is \$10.00. Discounted retakes are good for 12 months after the test attempt. The 2014 GED® testing series consist of literacy, mathematics, science, and social studies. The new GED® tests are more in line with the state's Common Core Standards. These new GED® test are designed to help prepare students to be college and career ready. **For students who have taken GED® tests before 2014 and did not complete GED® requirements, these GED® tests have expired and you must start over.** However, motivated and qualified instructors are in place to help you reach your educational goals!

*Students must take a Pre-EMT Basic class and a reading placement test and score a minimum of a 12th grade reading level in order to register for EMT-Basic. Students who do not score 12th grade level may enroll in the Learning Center free of charge and will be allowed to re-test only upon recommendation of the Learning Center staff.
