



East Carolina University & Halifax Community College Co-Admission Agreement

East Carolina University (ECU) and Halifax Community College (HCC) enter into a co-admission agreement designed to improve transfer student access and success through a collaborative baccalaureate degree completion program.

Partnership Objectives:

- Improve access to baccalaureate degree programs (see Transfer Programs addendum).
- Improve transfer retention and graduation rates.
- Provide students with a seamless degree-completion pathway.
- Improved efficiency to degree completion.
- Remove student success barriers.
- Optimize student services and resources.
- Prepare students to succeed in a global society.
- Strengthen the partnership between ECU and HCC.

Requirements:

- Students must have graduated high school or be in their first year of community college enrollment prior to applying for co-admission.
- Submit a complete co-admissions application and official high school transcripts or GED scores.
- Commit to full-time status (a minimum of 12 semester hours) at HCC.
- Students must complete the requirements for an Associate in Science, Associate in Arts, Associate in Fine Arts, or Associate in Engineering degree at HCC.
- Prior to registering for ECU classes, students must provide immunization documentation, complete the Campus Safety Questions, and meet admissions requirements as stated in the ECU Undergraduate Catalog (including a cumulative 2.5 minimum GPA).

Student Benefits:

- Guaranteed admission to ECU (note admission to certain degree-completion programs are departmental decisions)
- Shared electronic records management system
- Waived ECU transfer application fee
- Joint academic advising
- Joint financial aid counseling and co-admission micro-scholarship opportunities
- Eligible to receive an ECU One Card (student ID card)
- Eligible for Student Pirate Club Membership
- Access to ECU Libraries
- Access to programming through the Office of Student Activities and Organizations at ECU
- Access to NCCCS Event days on ECU's campus

ECU-and HCC commit to maximizing student success and an annual review of this partnership agreement.
