This BILATERAL AGREEMENT (Agreement) is made on the date of the last signature below (Effective Date) by and between Fayetteville State University and Halifax Community College.

- I. The term of this Agreement (Term) shall begin on the Effective Date and shall continue for a period of five (5) years. Either party may terminate this Agreement with or without cause by providing 30 days written notice to the other party. Additionally, this Agreement may be terminated as outlined herein or because of a breach. However, any students who have matriculated at FSU pursuant to this Agreement shall be continued through the completion of the Degree Program.
- II. The parties grant to each other a non-exclusive, non-transferable license to use each other's trademarks and service marks in furtherance of the articulation Agreement detailed herein or in a manner solely for the purpose of identifying and communicating the existence of the relationship to HCC students and alums. Should either institution request in writing, that use of the originating institution's trademarks and/or service marks be discontinued, the non-originating institution shall cease and desist such use of the trademarks and/or service marks.
- III. The parties hereto have the relationship of independent contractors for all purposes. Each will have complete control over its own performance and the details for accomplishing its own obligations under this Agreement. In no event will the agents, representatives, or employees of one party be deemed to be agents, representatives, or employees of the other.
- IV. The Agency certifies that instructors teaching courses listed in the Exhibit B transfer course table meet the minimum faculty credentialing requirements for FSU's regional accrediting body, the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges.
- V. Attached hereto, and incorporated herein by reference, is "Exhibit A," which outlines the academic requirements for admission into the University and specific requirements for admission into the program.
- VI. The attached document, titled "Exhibit B," contains the transfer course table.
- VII. Both FSU and the agency shall each select a designated representative to coordinate the requirements of this agreement.

#### EXHIBIT A

Academic requirements for admission into the University and specific requirements for admission into the program.

This Agreement establishes a plan where a student at Halifax Community College (the Agency) will complete an Associate degree in Nursing and be admitted to the School of Nursing at FSU for the continuation and completion of a Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing. Upon successfully completing the FSU academic requirements, the student shall be awarded a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing from FSU.

**Program Requirements:** 

- Students will receive a degree plan that will specify the courses required at each institution, with equivalent courses noted to earn an ADN in Nursing at HCC and a BSN in Nursing at FSU
- Students will be responsible for fulfilling all obligations of both institutions, including tuition and all required fees.

#### FSU Program Requirements

- Students may complete the program full-time in 2.5 semesters, taking two courses online every 8 weeks, or part-time, taking one course every eight weeks with completion of the program in 5 semesters.
- RN are urged to complete non-nursing courses before starting the upper-division nursing courses.
- Students may start before all non-nursing courses are completed; however, it is preferred that no more than 4 non-nursing courses are left to complete, which will contribute to early time to degree with your nursing courses.
- The nursing program is 10 nursing courses totaling 32 credit hours.
- There are 9 courses at 3 credits each and one course at 5 credits.

Students failing to obtain an associate in nursing Degree may transfer courses, as shown in Exhibit B, provided the students earn a grade of "C" or better in the classes.

### Admission Requirements:

- Students admitted to FSU's BSN program of study must meet the admission requirements of Halifax Community College and FSU.
- Admission to Fayetteville State University.
   Active and unencumbered RN license.
- Evidence of an earned associate degree in nursing.
- Submission of the RN to BSN Application to the School of Nursing.

#### FSU Admission Requirement

Applications are accepted by May 1 for Summer admission.

#### Academic Procedures:

- HCC will serve as the "home school" for the first two years of the student's enrollment in the FSU BSN program, and FSU will serve as the "home school" for the remainder of program completion.
- Core Requirements: Minimum of 32 credits in the core curriculum is required of all students.
- Grade of C or higher in all nursing courses.
- Graduation Requirements: All graduating seniors are required to complete the Graduating Senior Assessment after completing 90 or more semester hours (including credit by

examination), but not later than the graduation semester. Students are required to complete a minimum total of 120 credits for the BSN degree.
