Dental Hygienist

A dental hygienist is a licensed preventative oral care professional that provides educational, clinical, and therapeutic services to the public. In order to become prepared to perform these services, the dental hygienist requires an extensive educational background. Most people first meet the dental hygienist in a private dental office where the hygienist performs many critical services that detect, prevent, and treat diseases of the mouth. Career paths for dental hygienists include positions in clinical dentistry, administration, sales, education, research, consumer advocacy, hospital dentistry, and public health. Career opportunities are global.

Responsibilities of a Licensed Dental Hygienist

Dental Hygiene graduates from our program will be able to:

- Perform infection control procedures.
- Perform general and oral health assessments.
- Provide nutritional counseling and self-care programs to prevent disease.
- Examine head, neck, and oral regions for disease.
- Expose and process radiographs and perform other diagnostic tests.
- Complete oral prophylaxis and other preventive services.
- Administer medications prescribed by a licensed dentist.
- Provide oral hygiene care instruction.
- Place and remove temporary fillings and periodontal dressings.
- Remove sutures.

Halifax Community College Dental Hygiene Program Mission

The mission of the Dental Hygiene Program is to facilitate the development of professional, ethical, and competent entry-level dental hygienists that exhibit the following:

- An awareness of their present and future roles and responsibilities within the profession and the community served.
- The knowledge and clinical skills necessary to provide comprehensive care to patients.
- A commitment to lifelong learning and professional development.

The dental hygiene curriculum provides the dental hygiene student with the knowledge and skills to assess, plan, implement, and evaluate dental hygiene care for the individual and the community. The curriculum also teaches the dental hygiene student to collaborate with the dentist, the patient, and other health professionals to provide comprehensive patient care. Graduates will receive an Associate of Applied Science Degree and will be eligible to take national and clinical dental hygiene licensing examinations.

MINIMUM ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

All items (#1-9) must be completed and submitted by **January 29, 2027**

1. Submit a completed Halifax Community College Application (www.halifaxcc.edu) indicating Dental Hygiene (A45260) as the Program of Study
2. Submit official transcripts:
 - a. records of high school graduation or equivalency
 - b. all post-secondary transcripts
3. Complete course requirements or submit minimum scores on placement tests **if college courses have not been completed**

Meet **MATH** proficiency with one of the following:

Completion of a college level mathematics course with a minimum grade of "C"

Completion of prerequisites to be eligible to take CHM 130

A minimum score on a placement test (ACT, SAT, NC Community College placement test)

Meet high school GPA policy to waive placement test and place into CHM 130.

Meet **ENGLISH/READING** proficiency with one of the following:

Completion of ENG 111 or equivalent with a minimum grade of "C"

Completion of prerequisites to be eligible to register for ENG 111 without co-requisite

Meet minimum score on a placement test (ACT, SAT, NC Community College placement test)

Meet high school GPA policy to waive placement test and place into ENG 111 without co-requisite.

Meet **CHEMISTRY** Proficiency requirement with one of the following:

Complete CHM 090 with a "C" or better

Complete high school chemistry with a "C" or better

Complete college Chemistry (CHM 130/CHM 131/CHM 151) with a "C" or better

4. Attend a 2026-2027 Dental Hygiene Information Session to receive updates on the application and selection process to the HCC Dental Hygiene Program. **The applicant must attend an information session for the 2027 application cycle.** (page 3)

6. Complete the Dental Hygiene Health Sciences Admission Application. This application is available after the applicants attend a 2026-2027 Dental Hygiene Information Session.
7. Provide evidence of an overall 2.8 GPA
GPA is determined by **most recent college transcript with a minimum of 12 hours of non-developmental credit.*
8. Submit **one** of the following documents:
 - a. Completed Dental Observation **and** Dental Hygiene Interview Form (pages 9-10)
 - b. Current enrollment with an ADA accredited Dental Assisting (DA II) Program Form (page 11)
 - c. Completed Dental Assisting Experience Documentation Form (DA I or DA II) (page 12)
9. ****Once an applicant has attended an information session and completed a Health Sciences Application, they are then eligible to register for the HESI A2 placement examination at HCC.**** After attending an information session, applicants will need to take the HESI admission assessment (A2). Testing will be offered at Halifax Community College from August 2026 through January 2027. Test scores are valid for three years (for example, for the 2027 application year, the HESI A2 test must have been completed no earlier than February 2024). Applications with submissions beyond the deadline will not be considered. Students may take the HESI A2 at HCC up to two times per admission cycle. Please make the testing coordinator aware if you are a second time test taker. Preference for testing dates will be given to first time test takers. Test results are accepted from external testing sites provided an official copy of the results are submitted to HCC Admissions prior to the deadline. Students will be required to pay \$61.00 (fees subject to change) with each attempt to take the A2. Fees need to be paid at the HCC Cashier's Office. Please bring a copy of your receipt with you on testing day. Picture ID is required at the testing site. A minimum score of 65% is required for consideration. Students who are repeat testers must notify the testing coordinator prior to sitting for the exam. We will also accept the ATI TEAS test with a score of 59% or higher that has been taken within 3 years. This test is not offered at HCC.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

- Admission to the Dental Hygiene Program is limited to eighteen (18) students each August.
- Applications will be accepted through January 29, 2027.
- Applicants must submit all required documents to the HCC Admissions Office, including all test scores by January 29, 2027.
- **Applicants are responsible for submitting all required documents by January 29, 2027.**
- Deadlines, guidelines, and policies apply equally to all students

Halifax Community College does not maintain a waiting list. **Applicants to the Dental Hygiene Program must reapply each year.** Applicants who are not selected for the Dental Hygiene Program for the current admissions cycle must reapply each year.

DENTAL HYGIENE STUDENT SELECTION PROCESS

The Halifax Community College Dental Hygiene Program uses a *"point system"* for the student selection process. Preference is given to students with the highest points based on the selection criteria, which include all completed documentation that is submitted by the deadline of **January 29, 2027**. **Please submit documents to**

***All certifications, licenses, and credentials used for admission ranking points be current, active, and verifiable. Applicants are required to provide official documentation or proof of certification/licensure at the time of application submission. Incomplete or unverified credentials will not be considered for ranking points.**

****Veteran status must be verified through official military documentation, typically the DD Form 214 (Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty), indicating discharge under honorable or general under honorable conditions. Additional documentation, such as DD Form 215, NGB Form 22, or a VA Benefits Summary Letter, may be accepted when applicable, in accordance with institutional verification requirements.**

If the ranking process results in the same score for more than one qualified student to be offered a seat after considering the above criteria, the seat will be given first to a student that has the highest overall HESI A2 or Teas test score.

Applicants with the highest selection points (close to 23 points) have a better chance of being selected into the HCC Dental Hygiene Program.

DENTAL HYGIENE PROGRAM GENERAL INFORMATION

Applicants who have credit for any **DEN** didactic courses will be **required to audit** the course during the respective semester in the curriculum. A student who audits a course is required to obtain written permission to audit the course. The audited course(s) will not be covered by financial aid.

If a prospective student has credit for any **DEN preclinic lab or clinic course from another institution**, the student is **required to retake** the course in order to graduate from the Halifax Community College Dental Hygiene Program.

Tuberculosis Screening---mandatory
Hepatitis B---mandatory
Measles / Mumps / Rubella---mandatory
- Purchase student malpractice insurance
- Purchase required clinical equipment (instruments / handpieces / personal protective equipment)
Instruments cannot be used
